## **High School Reading, Writing, and Study Skills**

**Dates:** June 14 - July 16, M - F

**Time:** 9:00AM - 11:00AM

**Teacher:** Mrs. Whitwill

**Open To:** Entering 9th and 10th grades

- This course builds decoding, vocabulary, comprehension and writing skills necessary for success in high school. Students will also read one summer reading book and complete the summer reading project. Student can enroll in in 3, 4 or the full 5 weeks. Credit is given based on the number of weeks completed (1 credit per week). Pass/Fail grade. \$250/week. ESY eligible.

## **Building College Reading Skills**

**Dates:** June 14 - July 16, Tuesday & Thursday

**Time:** 9:00AM - 11:00AM

**Teacher:** Mrs. Garner

**Open To:** Entering 11th and 12th grades

- This course will examine the 10 steps to build your reading skills to prepare for college to help you become a better reader and stronger thinker. Students will gain strategies for improving vocabulary and comprehension for academic reading. Credit based on weeks completed in course. Pass/Fail grade. \$100/week. ESY eligible.

- Based on the number and strengths of students, we will read, analyze, perform and produce a short, one act play. Students will practice memorizing lines, developing stage blocking, creating costumes and sets, and adding their own personal touches to the portrayal of the story. The course will end with an outdoor or virtual production of the play. Student's must enroll in all three weeks. 3 credits Pass/Fail grade. \$250/week. ESY eligible.

## Summer Art Project

**Open to:** All students

- Join Mr. Dawson for a summer art project. The medium for the project is TBD, glass, print-making, painting. You'll come away with new skills and beautiful piece to share. Student's must enroll in all three weeks. 3 credits. Pass/Fail grade. \$250/week. ESY eligible.

## Creative Writing

**Dates:** June 14 - July 16, Monday, Wednesday, Friday

**Open to:** All students

- We'll write each day ("daily" journaling), examine short narratives, poetic form, analyze film dialogue, collective story writing, among several other imagination-bending activities. Credits determined by weeks enrolled. Pass/Fail grade. \$150/week. ESY eligible.

## Music Appreciation

**Dates:** June 14 - July 16, Monday, Wednesday, Friday

**Time:** 9:00AM - 11:00AM

**Teacher:** Mr. Hoopes

**Open to:** All students

- We will be listening to music together and discussing its construction, culture of origin, examining instruments and the technology behind them, looking at music's relationship to dance / film & drama etc, and in many ways learning how to listen to the larger world in new ways. Credits determined by weeks enrolled. Pass/Fail grade. \$150/week. ESY eligible.

## **Heroes Around The World**

**Dates:** June 14 - July 2, Tuesday and Thursday

**Time:** 9:00AM - 11:00AM

**Teacher:** Dr. Rasmussen

**Open to:** All students

- We will explore heroic characters from ancient Mesopotamia, to the Vikings, all the way up to the present day. As we enjoy the stories and look at how other artists depict them, we will also make our own creative projects, from building weapons to designing pottery. \$100/week. ESY eligible.

## **Meditation, Mindfulness & Yoga**

**Dates:** June 14 - July 2, Tuesday and Thursday

**Time:** 9:00AM - 11:00AM

**Teachers:** Mr. Trevigne & Ms. Storey

- Students will learn principles of Mindfulness, and the benefits of developing a meditation /mindfulness practice. Students will learn how to meditate and will practice alongside of learning the how, when, why, and where of meditation. Yoga will be integrated, teaching students to move through postures (asanas) with a mindful breath. Increasing strength, balance, and awareness. \$100/week. ESY eligible.

### **Website Design - June 14 - 18, 2021 - \$165/student**

- In this course, students will learn how to code a responsive web site in HTML and CSS. Specifically, students will learn about how the web pages boilerplate code helps organize the page for proper display on various browsers as well as create semantic tags for page layouts. With CSS style sheets, students will decide on background colors, borders, and fonts for each of the elements on the page as well as learn how to target specific items using the class attribute.



# SUMMER SCHOOL COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

## **Website Design II - June 21 - 25, 2021 - \$165/student**

- In this course, students will build on their previous experience to create a web page for a fictitious restaurant, in HTML and CSS. After deciding on the page's assets such as images, menu items and font types, students will begin building a multi-page website with images, links and descriptions pertaining to the different data being displayed on-page. Students will learn about how to link multiple pages together, create separate CSS files for specific pages and design for both desktop and mobile displays.

## **Tangible/Robotics Coding - June 28 - July 2, 2021 - \$165/student**

- In this course, students will use a variety of robots to compose various projects such as stories, solving sequences and creating images. These images are composed by creating sequences in the application. Students will program the robots using block-based/tangible coding to move forward-backwards and rotate around based on desired degree and position, creating shapes such as polygons, stars and triangles.

## **Introduction to Python - July 6 - July 9, 2021 - \$165/student**

- In this course, students will learn how to code in the language of Python to create applications that run in the Repl terminal. Students will create 2d graphics-based games such as flappy bird and draw shapes with the turtle module. They will learn how to code variables if statements and run loops to modify data as well as learn about importing modules and using custom library assets.

## **Python Game Design - July 12 - July 6, 2021 - \$165/student**

- In this course, students will learn how to code in the language of Python to create applications that run in the Repl terminal. Students will build on their previous experiences with variables, loops and if statements to create a variety of games such as War and an RPG stats adventure. Specifically, in this course, they will create tuples, pull data from lists and arrays, compile sequences into custom functions and create conditions for various outcomes. By creating games students are familiar with, they will be able to understand the logic and incorporate it into the coding of the app.
